



2. LABEL PRIORITY ROOMS

Label boxes with both the **room and** urgency. IE: "Kitchen - unpack first," or "Kid's room - first"

Don't waste time or money moving what you

don't love. Donate/sell to make some extra cash.

3. COLOR-CODE WITH STICKERS OR TAPE

Assign each room a color. Add colored tap or stickers to boxes for quick unloading. IE: Green for Kitchen or Pink for girl's room.



4. PACK ESSENTIALS BIN

Include towels, scissors, light bulbs, toilet paper, charges, meds, can opener... you'll thank yourself later






Snap pics of the back of your TV / Computer **before** unplugging them.

6. SET UP 'DO NOT PACK ZONE'

Dedicate a room/area for items movers shouldn't touch - documents, personal documents, etc.

7. KEEP 1 BOX FOR "1ST NIGHT NECESSITIES"

Think: Kids PJs, coffee supplies, favorite blanks etc.

8. USE ZIPLOCK BAGS FOR HARDWARE

Keeps screws & bolts from furniture together in labeled bages taped to their respective items.



9. SNAP INVENTORY PHOTOS

Photo valuables, furniture condition, & your packed boxes, especially for military moves and insurance.

10. USE PLASTIC WRAP ON DRAWERS

If you can, leave lightweight items in drawers & plastic wrap them closed to save time un/packing.



11. PACK SUITCASES W/CLOTHES

Roll clothes into suitcases to avoid extra boxes. Bonus: Easy access while on the road.

12. USE LAUNDRY BASKETS AS CONTAINERS

Toss in shoes, pet gear, towels or last-minute items that didn't get packed up. Consider storing your plunger in your garbage bin!



13. KEEP SNACKS & WATER HANDY

Hangry kids (and husbands) make a hard day harder. Keep healthy snacks nearby. ALWAYS.


14. SCHEDULE CHILDCARE

If you can, get help keeping little ones busy during packing.

15. USE TRASH BAGS FOR HANGING CLOTHES

Slide a trash bag over hanging clothes while still on the hangers, makes unpacking a breeze.

16. PACK PLATES VERTICALLY

Like records! Less breakage, use dish towels or bubble wrap between.



17. TOTE YOUR IMPORANT DOCUMENTS IN A BINDER OR FIREPROOF BAG

Birth certificates, passports, military orders, pet records – all SHOULD STAY WITH YOU!

18. PHOTOGRAPH EMPTY ROOMS BEFORE LEAVING

Especially in base housing – this is essential to prove cleanliness or damage-free condition.



19. KEEP A SHARPIE IN YOUR POCKET

You'll n eed it 37 times during a move – trust me!

20. GIVE YOURSELF GRACE

Everything won't go perfectly. That's OK! Focus on what matters: Your family, your peace and getting there safely.
